# FINDINGS OF THE DEBT ANALYSIS

- Outstanding Bonds bear interest at very low rates
- Many past borrowings included a principal forgiveness portion of the debt
- Structure of the NJ IBank Financing reflects 75%/50% of the loan is interest
- Many of the ACUA borrowings have already been financed at lower rates by the NJ IBank and the savings passed on to the ACUA
- A few relevant bond issues have call dates in the future benefit will be lost because principal balances due will be significantly less
- It was determined that it is not financially prudent to payoff any outstanding NJIB Loans and it magnified the benefits of financing through the NJ IBank
